# Guide Map – Section 2



# Return to Elm Ave and go left



- After 1 block you come to the Chauncey Stuntz House on the left (circa 1868). Stuntz platted his subdivision in 1892 – the last of the original ones.
- Now proceed down Elm Avenue.

# Log Cabin

- Proceed down Elm and you will see the Scout log cabin on the right, built by the WPA under the “New Deal” in 1936.



# “Gravelotte”

- Across the street from the school is Gravelotte. It was built ca 1869 by T. R. Biggs who platted an acre south west of Douglas and Elm and for whom the subdivision is named. It was platted in 1873.



# Terrace Park Elementary School

- On the other side of Elm Ave. is the Elementary school.
- Before it was merged with Mariemont in 1957, it was the Terrace Park School which included a High School.
- In 2011 it will be extensively rebuilt.



# International House

- Continue south on Elm and turn left onto Stanton.
- At 803 Floral is the International House, built about 1935. It is one of the few remaining examples of this style in the Cincinnati area.



# Stanton Fields

- Return to Elm on Stanton and come to Stanton Fields on the left.
- Many school and club sporting activities take place here.
- Turn left and continue south on Elm Avenue.
